Its history is linked with the Chao Phraya River, and there are many places of interest to visit, such as temples, the Bang Pa-in Royal Palace and the Bang Sai Royal Folk Arts and Crafts Centre in Ayutthaya Province, and Ko Kret in Nonthaburi Province. Just a two hour drive from Bangkok, a nice stop could be pinned at Khao Wang (Palace Hill), located up on a 92-meter high verdant hill, in the City of Phetchaburi. The highest peak is home of Wat Phra Kaew and the 360 degree views on the top.

In Pranburi, Phraya Nakhon Cave's mystical temple is a bit harder to reach - nestled deep in Khao Sam Roi Yot National Park and requiring a boat and 430-meter hike. The effort is worth it though, as you'll be rewarded with a glittering gem - a structure fit for a treasure-hunt movie. After taking pictures and admiring the view, enjoy a meal at the restaurant near the cave's steps.
